This is not a competition, but all your photographs will be displayed on the Forest of Bowland website, and a selection will also be chosen to feature in a 2017 calendar. Any profits from the calendar will be donated to Champion Bowland.

Note: Champion Bowland is a small charity which works to enhance the outstanding landscape of the Forest of Bowland AONB. It does this by raising funds from visitor donations and charitable activity; and these funds are then awarded to local projects which benefit the environment, local communities and visitors.

- I. All ages and abilities welcome.
- 2. Entrants under the age of 18 years need to have parent or guardian consent to enter and should provide a contact number or email address for their parent/guardian, as well as their own name.

- 4. Electronic images only will be accepted with a maximum file size of 15mb.
- 5. Name and contact information is kept only for the purpose of us contacting you about the photo celebration. By entering your photographs you agree to the Forest of Bowland AONB collecting, saving and processing your personal data for this purpose.
- 6. The closing date for a chance to be part of the calendar is 31st May 2016, but we will continue to take website submissions for the duration of 2016.
- 7. All entries must be the **original work** of the entrant and must not infringe the rights of any other party. The entrants must be the sole owner of copyright in all photographs entered and must have **obtained permission** -to use or feature any people, content or other material, or must have the legal consent of the parents/guardians of any children under 8 who are are featured. People should be made aware that the images may appear on websites and in printed and other media. Further, entrants must not have breached any laws when taking their photographs.
- 8. Entrants will retain copyright of the photographs that they submit to the Forest of Bowland partnership. By submitting your photographs all entrants grant the Forest of Bowland partnership¹ the right to publish and exhibit their photographs on websites, print and other media related to the promotion of the Forest of Bowland AONB. No fees will be payable for any of the above uses. While we make every effort to credit photographers, including in printed reproductions of their work, we cannot guarantee that every broadcast use of the photographs will include the photographers' names.
- 9. If photographers selected for inclusion in the calendar are unable to be contacted after reasonable attempts have been made, we reserve the right to contact other photographers.
